CHRISTMAS TREE LOT SUMMARY

First, a bit of history on our club's Christmas tree sales. My records only go back to 1996, however I am told that prior to that date a group of volunteers actually got a truck and harvested about 100 and 200 trees in previous years to raise some cash for the club. Needless to say, they found it very labor intensive and few were enthusiastic to continue with their own harvesting.

In 1996 where my records start, we bought 450 trees. Only 384 were sold, 12 were donated via radio announcement and 65 were junked. Even so, a profit of over \$1500 was realized. Certainly, enough to encourage the Executive to continue yearly sales and keep our membership dues as low as possible. 48 volunteers made this happen in 1996 and tree sales became an annual event.

This year, although the final figures aren't available yet, approximately 120 volunteers spent over 1500 hours making about 130 wreaths and selling all but 9 of our 950 trees.

This was a bit of a reduction from the last few years. Our supplier explains that trees are very scarce now and will be for the next few years until their crop matures. This problem is with most if not all suppliers, at the price we prefer to pay. We are already warned that the prices will continue to go up for the next few years. Point of interest . . . a recent news article cited the average Christmas tree now costs \$78 in larger cities. So far, we are able to hold our prices reasonable and keep our customers coming back.

This year things got underway with the tree lot setup on Saturday Nov 16th and (very late) arrival of the transport on Monday Nov 18th. Sales started on Saturday Nov 23rd and last tree sold Friday Dec 13th. Three weeks to the day.

I really can't say enough to thank all our volunteers for both the sales efforts and those who worked long and hard on the wreaths. Beautiful again this year by the way! It was most encouraging to see some new volunteers come out this year. I'm sure you all enjoyed the time you spent with many of your fellow members and longtime volunteers.

Volunteering. Getting involved. Helping out. These make the difference from being "a real club member" or being "just a club member". If you spent productive time on our Christmas tree and wreath project, this was your financial contribution to support the activities and operational costs of your club.

A sincere thanks to everyone who treated with cookies, snacks and all things good. Also, to all the Executive team for their unheralded background work and support throughout. Last but not least a big thank you to all the partners taking care of the home front while our volunteers are at the club. Your contribution must never be underestimated.

Trusting everyone will enjoy the year to come and you'll be available to do it all again next season.

GUNS AND AMMUNITION WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE

DANGER – THIN ICE

Ice has started to form on the pond and is unsafe to support weight. Please stay on the docks to fish until the ice has completely formed and is at least 10 cm. thick.

Please close the gates to all docks to keep the geese from venturing onto the property.

The ice around the windmill will always be unsafe due to aeration stones which are marked with buoys. Keep well away from the windmill area.

Do not let your pet run loose on the property, including the ice. It is the club policy that all dogs be leashed at all times and in control of their owners. It is often best to leave your pet at home.

A minimum of four inches (10 cm.) of CLEAR ICE is necessary to support the weight of one person. If you are fishing with a partner or a group, additional ice thickness is required.

The ice conditions are monitored regularly but not posted. Please stay off any unsafe ice and remember that ice conditions vary from day to day. Obey the thin ice signs and exercise caution at all times on pond ice. When in doubt, stay off the ice. Always use the "Buddy" system and never venture out alone.

Mark your fishing holes with a flag or small branch – for safety and consideration of others.

An ice rink will be made near the main dock when ice conditions permit. Ice fishing is not permitted with 15 m of this rink.

Ice derbies will be held throughout the winter months and often on very short notice. If you want telephone notification of scheduled derbies, please leave your name and number with Stan Gibbs. The derby dates will be posted on the website and the Bulletin Boards at the club.

HALL RENTALS

Did you know that the WOFGPA hall can be rented for your next "special" occasion for a very reasonable price? The hall has a maximum seating capacity of 80 persons, which makes it just the right size for a small wedding reception, bridal and baby showers, your next meeting, anniversary party, family reunions and get-togethers, Christmas party and birthdays.

The hall is available to members or their families to get together after the passing of a loved one. In certain circumstances, a special reduced rate may apply. Members receive a discount on rentals which occur on Friday or on a Saturday evening only.


