With the warm temperatures and daylight savings time thrown in to the mix, there are more opportunities to wet a line.

With so many unused fishing rods being put into action after a long cold winter, the possibilities of crowding our docks is inevitable.

At this time, I would like to remind everyone that proper fishing etiquette be observed.

Take care not to crowd another fisherman, do not cast your line across another fisherman's line, and respect your fellow angler.

I would also like to remind all the people who use our fish cleaning station to properly clean all surfaces (top and two shelves) after you are done.

Please remember to drive slowly on the property and driveway. Driving slower reduces kicking up gravel, which creates potholes and scratches vehicles. Watch for pedestrians at all times. Do not park in the main driveway or on either side of the driveway by the club hall and boat rack. The drive is quite narrow in these areas and limits access for others. Our two parking areas: the main lot and at the boat rack are large enough to accommodate all vehicles.

WE HAVE WORMS!

The worms cost just \$ 3.00 per dozen. As many anglers have already discovered, the worm machine at the club has been filled. If you have any issues with the machine or the worms, please contact Steve at 668-6257 (evenings). Steve regularly checks the machine and feeds the worms.

Draw prizes available at each General Meeting. The winner of the May General Meeting draw was D. Clark who won lures and Power Bait.

If you attend a general meeting and complete a ballot, your name is entered to win a one-year membership. Only one ballot per membership per month is allowed.

Catch and Release

At the May General Meeting, a motion was brought forward to allow Catch and Release of Trout to be practiced by the anglers who chose to do so, after being shown the proper technique. A lengthy discussion occurred with input from the members present regarding all the good and not so good points and how each would affect other anglers.

The Executive decided that Catch and Release will not be permitted at WOFGPA and that the current fishing rules stand. They agreed that although Catch and Release was good practice, it was not in the best interest of the majority of the membership. It is time to review the club's fishing rules and how each applies to you, which is determined by your membership.

Family: Limit is 4 Trout in one day with no angler catching more than two Trout

Single: Limit of 2Trout in one day

Senior Citizen: Limit 4 Trout in one day with no angler catching more than two Trout

Youth / Sponsored Youth: Limit two Trout in one day, which are counted as part of the Family membership.

Sponsored Child: Limit two Trout in one day, which are counted as part of the Sponsor's limit.

- Membership cards must be visibly worm while on the property while fishing and should be worn while on the property.
- No one may angler for someone else. Only one line per angler and it must be attended.
- Any angler catching 2 trout must cease fishing for the day. All trout caught must be registered as part of that angler's daily limit (even if you give the fish away).
- No trout may be returned to the pond once it is caught.
- All bass must be returned to the pond with the least possible harm to the fish. Bass must not be intentionally targeted until the official season opening.
- No minnows, dead, alive or preserved, and no corn are to be used as bait.
- All children under 16 must be accompanied and supervised by an adult cardholder. A guest is limited to twice per year per membership.
- If you have any questions or comments about the rules, please contact any of the Executive members or attend a meeting.

At the June General meeting, on Thursday, June 8, we will be holding the Barbeque Meat Draw. The format is the same as the Turkey Roll in December. There are 10 Barbeque meat packs to be won. Tickets cost only \$ 1.00 each. Remember that nothing tastes better from the barbeque than meat that you won.

2nd Annual Juniors Derby
