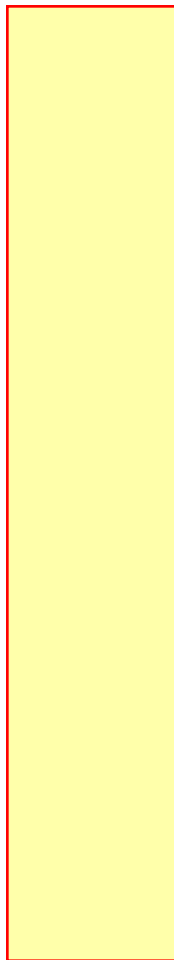
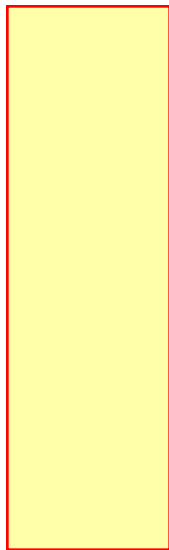

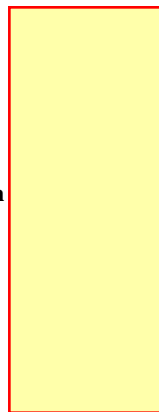

OFF LIMITS

SHORELINE RESTORATION AREA

It has come to the attention of the Executive that some anglers have blatantly ignored the fenced area located along the shoreline at WOFGPA. This area contains young plants that are native to the area and were planted at a considerable cost. It was purposely fenced off to allow these plants to grow without damage from people. As these plants mature, they will assist in stopping the erosion that is occurring along the shoreline between the two main docks. Each time an angler goes into this area, a few young plants are destroyed.

We understand that each angler has their own "special" spot to cast their line but these "special spots" can be easily accessed from one of the docks or from a boat.

KEEP OUT OF THE FENCED OFF SHORELINE RESTORATION AREA.

If this practice continues, the angler(s) will be required to provide an explanation of their actions to the Executive and may be subject to disciplinary action, which could include termination of their membership.
